► Phase 2 to the West Hollywood Design District Streetscape Master Plan

IMPROVEMENT SITES

- 1) public gathering spaces
NE corner of Beverly/Robertson
SE corner of Melrose/Norwich
- 2) flexible festival street
North Robertson
- 3) pedestrian paseos
North of Melrose, between
Almont and Robertson

Phase 1 (The Streetscape Master Plan) identified improvements for Beverly, Melrose, and Robertson. Phase 2 will focus on the design of public spaces in the district (listed above).

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

The West Hollywood Design District Streetscape Master Plan was adopted by City Council in summer 2013. The Plan was developed with the help of a consultant team and a community working group, composed of over a dozen business owners and residents in the area. During Plan adoption, City Council requested that the public gathering spaces identified in the Master Plan be further developed through a community design process. This summer, the City will begin phase 2 of the project, hosting three community workshops to help finalize the vision for new public spaces in the West Hollywood Design District. Please join us!
